

Ebenezer Church Profile

We were originally established in 1886, although the current building dates from the late 1980s and was refurbished in 2020. We are so grateful to God for his faithfulness in sustaining us for nearly 150 years.

The town of Mold has a population of about 10000 with 56% between age 18 and 64, 20% are 0 – 17 and 24% are 65 and over. Education is available in Mold through the medium of Welsh or English from primary school to age 18 and there are good opportunities for work locally and in the nearby cities of Liverpool, Manchester, Chester and Wrexham. While Mold is predominantly English speaking, Welsh is spoken in town and in the surrounding villages. Ebenezer reflects this as the congregation includes both Welsh and English speakers.

The Ebenezer church family totals about 160 and we are blessed with 50 + children and young people. We are seeing an increasing number of new people who are new to Christianity or young in faith - in need of teaching and discipling. The congregation mostly live in Mold and the surrounding villages with a few travelling further. Services are in English and about 160 attend Sunday morning family worship with about 50 in the evening service. Both services are livestreamed. Music is an important part of our worship and we are blessed with many musicians and singers who lead us in a mixture of traditional and new songs.

We encourage the church family to join a homegroup for fellowship, prayer and to apply God's Word to our lives. Homegroups alternate with a whole church fortnightly prayer meeting. The women meet monthly for fellowship and prayer and some meet for weekly Bible study. The men also meet monthly for fellowship, teaching and evangelism.

We run groups for our children and youth during our morning services. We have also started a group for young adults which meets at the weekend.

Regular outreach to our community happens in many ways. We run a parent and toddler group and after school drop in during term time. Our Coffee Morning reaches out to older folk and we also run kids and youth clubs on a Friday night. Once a month we run a Messy Church which draws in a number of families from our community. A recent evangelistic 3-2-1 course for those enquiring about Christianity has resulted in a regular nurture group for those new to faith and church.

The church has a strong interest in global mission. Current mission partnerships cover work in Peru, France, Ireland, Uganda, the Gulf, the Philippines and a local prison, as well as among Muslims in Manchester, international students in London, and school 6th form students. Ebenezer also has a long-standing interest, experience and involvement in Church planting.
