Updated "Stay At Home" Guidance

No updates to "Safe Reopening of Places Of Worship" guidance expected before Tuesday March 23rd (so not all questions can be answered today)



From Friday March 12th

- 4 adults from 2 households can meet outdoors (including in gardens)
- 15 adults can participate in organised outdoor exercise or noncontact sport
- But legal travel restrictions not yet lifted



From Friday March 12th (continued)

- 4 teenagers (aged 12-17) from up to 4 households can meet outdoors (including in gardens)
- 15 teenagers can participate in oncontact sport or "other organised activities" (and legal travel restrictions lifted to attend)



From Friday March 26th

(subject to confirmation on March 23rd)

- Communal worship services can resume with the numbers cap lifted from 20 to 50 (where social distancing allows)
- Unclear if travel restrictions for congregants will apply
- No change to advice against congregational singing



Existing exemptions (until April 26th)

- Weddings (up to 5 people)
- Funerals (up to 20 people)

Where "necessary" and online would hinder the delivery of support:

- Support groups (e.g. young parents or addiction or counselling services)
- Food Banks
- Urgent pastoral care for vulnerable or to provide emergency help
- Hospital visitation
