About us

WBC is situated in the centre of Bath and recently celebrated its bicentenary. Over the past 200 years it has been known for its commitment to the gospel, Bible teaching and mission. Recently the Lord has graciously blessed us with a season of sustained growth.

We are a intergenerational church that is increasingly diverse, with people with from a range of cultural backgrounds. The church has a membership of almost 300, with a wider church family of approximately 500. We have a thriving kids programme as well as a significant number of both national and international students, for whom particular ministries are provided. We are blessed to have a true sense of church family. We are thankful for how many people are busy in the life of the church, forming deep friendships and bearing one another's burdens. Many of our members live outside of the Widcombe area, due to the cost of living centrally in the city, and are situated across the city and beyond.

What we believe

We are a conservative, reformed, evangelical church holding to both the inerrancy and the sufficiency of scripture. We believe the church should seek to reach the lost through the proclamation of the gospel and teach people, in the power of that same gospel and through the gift of the Spirit, to live lives in service to God whilst being continually transformed in character to the likeness of his Son.

In ministry and in the home we affirm the complementary natures of men and women, with the role of elder being reserved for men.

We practice believer's baptism, church membership, an open communion table and are congregational in governance. We are committed to both the plurality and parity of elders.

We are not a 'maximalist' church and accept a diversity of opinions on secondary matters within the church, provided members hold firmly to our doctrinal basis (see below) and do not act divisively.

Job Specification

Summary

Person Specification

The following are essentials for a successful candidate:

- Committed to godly, servant-hearted leadership
- Committed to the vision of Widcombe Baptist Church and in agreement with our Statement of Faith
- Enhanced DBS check and a commitment to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable adults
- Experience of and passion for working with young people, with a desire to foster whole-hearted discipleship, engagement with not-yet-believing friends and clarity and compassion with cultural hot-button issues
- A strong team player able to give and receive feedback, with a desire to learn and grow individually and as a team
- Strong organisational skills and ability to plan effectively
- Able to communicate effectively in written and verbal form, to build relationships with youth and parents

The nature of this post gives rise to an Occupational Requirement (under the Equality Act 2010) for the postholder to be a Christian. All staff in these posts are required to demonstrate a clear, personal commitment to the Christian faith.

Widcombe Baptist Church is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults. - Committed to the training and resourcing of parents
- Review present involvement of WBC Youth in summer camps
- Work in close partnership with 0-11s ministry leads
- Build connections with local secondary schools and supporting school CUs where appropriate

Terms and Conditions

This is a full time role. Working hours are over 5 days, and will include some evening commitments.

The salary for this role is £30,000 to £38,000 depending on skills and experience.

Holiday entitlement is 5 weeks per year plus statutory bank holidays. The Youth & Families Worker will be responsible to the pastors.
